Sister M. Anne Tieuli, 88, a member of the Daughters of Our Lady of Mercy, Villa Rossello, Newfield, NJ went to her eternal rest on Sunday, August 14, 2011, at Misericordia Nursing & Rehabilitation Center, York, PA.

Sister Anne, born in Brockton, Massachusetts, was the daughter of the late Francis (Frank) and Catherine (Mastrolito) Tieuli.

Sister Anne entered the Congregation of the Daughters of Our Lady of Mercy, in York, PA on February 1, 1944, and professed her Vows on August 16, 1945.

A faithful religious, Sister Anne was known for her spirit of prayer, and her genuine love for her religious congregation and for her large family of birth.

Having obtained her Bachelor's degree in education from College Misericordia, Dallas, PA, Sister Anne ministered for many years as a dedicated teacher in elementary parochial schools staffed by the religious order: in New Jersey - St. Mary Magdalene, Millville, St. Francis of Assisi, Vineland, St. Rose of Lima, Newfield and Little Flower School, Berkeley Heights. She also taught in Pennsylvania at Most Precious Blood, Hazleton. St. Mary's, Old Forge, St. Joan of Arc, Hershey, St. Joseph's in Berwick, and as a pre-school teacher at Holy Child Nursery, York. Many of her teaching years were spent in Massachusetts at Sacred Heart of Jesus in Milford and Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Springfield.

A very fine educator, Sister Anne showed a personal interest in each student and was always ready to help and encourage them. Artistic in nature, she enjoyed teaching art to the children and took great pride in their efforts and achievements. She also enjoyed teaching drama and was known for involving her students in many fine performances among which was a stirring annual pageant of the Passion of the Lord.
